Short Method: Geographically confirmed; Nile flows south to north.

Q48: Statement: Humans have 46 chromosomes.

Verification: Long Method: Human cells typically contain 46 chromosomes, arranged in 23 pairs. These include 22 pairs of autosomes and one pair of sex chromosomes (XX for females and XY for males). This chromosomal number is fundamental to human genetics and is supported by extensive genetic research and studies on human biology. Any deviation from this number usually results in genetic disorders. Therefore, the statement is true.

Short Method: Confirmed by genetic research; 46 chromosomes.
